Texas Eviction Notice. In line with Texas law, evictions must start with the landlord delivering an eviction notice to the tenant they wish to evict. A rental eviction notice, also known as a notice to vacate, is a written notice from the landlord given to the tenant to demand possession of the property from the tenant.

### How to Write an Eviction Notice in Texas | Eviction Tips

The Texas eviction notice is also known as a Demand for Possession or a Notice to Vacate. It must be in writing. The notice period to comply may be as short as 24-hours if it is written in the lease, or 3-days if no provision for the notice is provided.

### Navigate the Texas Eviction Process with a Notice to ...

Step 1: Notice to Vacate. The landlord must give you at least 3 days to move out before they can file an eviction suit, though it could be shorter or longer according to the lease; Step 2: Filing of Eviction Suit. The eviction hearing cannot take place for at least 10 days after the petition is filed. Step 3: Judgment.

This order from the Texas Supreme Court establishes the Texas Eviction Diversion Program, which aims to provide tenants and landlords with an alternative to eviction. Under the program, some renters may also be eligible for rental assistance as determined by the Texas Department of Housing and Community Affairs and its providers.

If the tenant does not move out after receiving this notice, then the landlord can file an eviction lawsuit (also called a forcible entry and detainer suit). How Landlords Must Serve Eviction Notices in Texas Landlords in Texas have four options for serving a notice to vacate under Texas Property Code sections 24.005(f)-(f-2) : The landlord, or an agent of the landlord, can personally give the notice to the tenant or to someone who is 16 years or older who lives in the rental property.
