A State Party may denounce the present Convention by written notification to the Secretary-General of the United Nations. Denunciation becomes effective one year after the date of receipt of the notification by the Secretary-General. Article 53. The Secretary-General of the United Nations is designated as the depositary of the present Convention.
